MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS AND HAPPENINGS

Auggies present at McNair Symposium – Ten Auggie McNair Scholars presented research findings at the 2011 McNair Symposium held August 4-7 at UC-Berkeley. The students, who were among more than 350 attendees, were the only Minnesotans on the roster (http://bit.ly/qrHQS4). In addition, Augsburg is one of only six Minnesota schools in the McNair program. Other McNair schools are Minnesota State University, Mankato, St. Olaf, St. Scholastica, St. Thomas, and the University of Minnesota-Twin Cities. The McNair program prepares students for doctoral studies through structured research and teaching opportunities, and includes a 10-week summer research project. The program was named in honor of Ronald E. McNair, one of the first African Americans in the U.S. space program. Urban Scrubs earned contribution from Boston Scientific – Urban Scrubs Camp was hosted by the College during the first week of August when more than 60 inner-city youths learned about a wide range of health-care related careers. The program provides a chance for young people in grades 9-12 to learn about and experience college. This year the program was awarded a \$15,000 grant from Boston Scientific.
