Good morning. Even as we continue to enjoy summer sun and heat, activities on campus are gearing up for the start of the new academic year. The campus remained busy this summer with annual programs such as the summer sports camps and the GEMS and GISE program that brought middle-school students from the Minneapolis public schools here for science and math projects. We also hosted the Urban Debate League camp, a film camp, and Medieval Minnesota. Other highlights from the summer:

- Augsburg joined with HealthForce Minnesota, Fairview, the Cedar Riverside Partnership and the University of Minnesota to host a five-day Urban Scrubs camp for students in grades 9–12 to live on campus and explore opportunities in the healthcare fields. More than 70 youth, many of them from the Cedar-Riverside neighborhood, participated in the camp, experiencing college life and connecting with some of our faculty, staff, and students during the week.
- Augsburg was selected to participate in the Travelers EDGE program, an initiative of the Travelers Company that focuses on recruitment and retention of low-income students of color from the St. Paul public schools. Augsburg was one of a small number of colleges selected for the program because of our success in recruiting students from underrepresented populations. Our Travelers EDGE project incorporates outreach, financial literacy enrichment, job shadowing and mentoring, and a scholarship program in the junior and senior year. We received a grant of \$44,000 for our first year of project participation and hope this will evolve into a five-year project.
- Our three summer sessions had very strong enrollments, enabling revenue to exceed our budget projections.

Next week, on August 31 and September 1, the Center for Teaching and Learning holds orientation for new faculty and staff (who started since last September). There will be planned opportunities for the campus community to meet them. For information on faculty/staff orientation, go to http://www.augsburg.edu/ctl/upcomingevents.html.

Opening week for fall semester begins with students moving back between September 2 and 6, and with Opening Convocation on Tuesday, Sept.7, and day classes beginning on Wednesday, Sept. 8. The convocation speaker will be English professor Robert Cowgill, the recipient of the 2010 Excellence in Teaching award. Rochester classes begin on September 7, and WEC and Bloomington classes begin on September 10. Graduate classes vary by program—see http://www.augsburg.edu/registrar/calendars.html.
