**Good morning.** What a wonderful weekend of customs, traditions, and celebration with more than 10,000 of Augsburg's alumni and friends at Velkommen Jul and Advent Vespers. Thanks to the faithful thousands who braved the snow on Friday and into Saturday to join us for the 31st annual Advent Vespers, "My Song in the Night." These meaningful Advent celebrations are wonderful gifts for both the Augsburg community and the wider world.

This week I travel to Oslo, Norway, to attend the Nobel Peace Prize ceremony and to share news with Norwegian educational and political leaders about a new vision for the annual Nobel Peace Prize Forum.

Over the past 22 years, the five Norwegian-American colleges in the Upper Midwest (Augsburg, along with Augustana-Sioux Falls, Concordia-Moorhead, Luther, and St. Olaf) have had the privilege of continuing and close contact with the Norwegian government and with the Nobel Peace Institute in Oslo. Our five colleges share governance of an annual Nobel Peace Prize Forum, which has been held on one of our campuses each spring. Augsburg hosted the 2010 forum last March, honoring the work of Martti Ahtisaari, former president of Finland and the 2008 Nobel Peace Prize laureate.

This annual celebration of the Nobel Peace Prize and the inspiration it provides for all of us who care about peacemaking will evolve into a new format beginning in spring 2012 (the 2011 forum will be held at Luther College on March 4 and 5, register at <a href="www.luther.edu/nppf">www.luther.edu/nppf</a>). We are excited that the new Nobel Peace Prize Forum will be held each year in the Twin Cities, organized by Augsburg, in close partnership with the Humphrey Institute of Public Affairs at the University of Minnesota, with the continuing support of our sister Norwegian Lutheran colleges, and with strong ties to other organizations in our area who share our commitment to education for peace. We are especially pleased with the forum's renewed focus on youth as peacemakers. Watch for more details about the newly-designed Peace Prize forum as our plans unfold in the next few months.
