On **March 14**, Auggies have a chance to put into action this commitment by participating in **Augsburg College Day at the Capitol**. Part of the Minnesota Private College Council Day at the Capitol, Auggies will meet with lawmakers to talk about the critical role of state support for higher education through the State Grant program. Auggies will depart campus at 9:15 a.m., and will meet with lawmakers, Gov. Mark Dayton's staff, and the MPCC.
