PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

Yesterday, Augsburg College hosted more than 240 attendees at the 2012 Augsburg College Scholarship Brunch. More than 100 donors and guests attended the event, which celebrated their generous contributions to named and endowed scholarships. Through these philanthropic gifts, the College received more than \$766,000 from donors in new outright gifts and future commitments. These gifts, when added to our existing scholarships, mean that nearly 450 students are currently receiving awards from privately funded scholarships. We are deeply grateful to these donors and families who see philanthropy as part of their calling and whose financial support helps so many students pursue their callings and share their gifts with the world.

As part of the College President's Climate Commitment, which provides the foundation for our "Green by 2019" initiative, the Augsburg Environmental Stewardship Committee this week is conducting a survey of transportation choices by our commuters. Commuting comprises 16 percent of our overall carbon footprint. The results help us accurately understand the overall carbon footprint of the College, and the information is critical as we look to become carbon neutral. Thank you to faculty, staff, and students who participated in the assessment of the College's admissions and enrollment effort conducted by Performa Higher Education last week. The reviewers affirmed strengths, such as Augsburg's clarity of mission and skilled admissions staff, and offered a number of recommendations to improve enrollment success. Next steps are to prioritize the recommendations and determine how they ought to inform the strategic enrollment planning process currently underway.
