MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS AND HAPPENINGS

Augsburg receives nearly \$600,000 NSF S-STEM grant. In May, Augsburg was awarded nearly \$600,000 in grant support for scholarships for undergraduates majoring in one of the sciences or mathematics. The AugSTEM scholarships will provide as much as \$7,500 per year to upper-division students. Partial funding is provided by the National Science Foundation Scholarships in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics (S-STEM) program under Award Number DUE-1154096. College announces first women's varsity lacrosse team in Minnesota. Augsburg College will add to its athletics roster the first women's varsity lacrosse team in the state and MIAC conference. The decision to add lacrosse, which is one of the 10 largest high school sports in the nation, was made earlier this month.

The program is anticipated to draw as many as 30 new student-athletes to Augsburg and demonstrates the College's ongoing support of women's athletics.

A coach will be hired, and will start recruiting during the 2012-13 academic year. The first official varsity season will be during Spring 2014. The Athletics Department announced the formation of the team at a MIAC Athletic Directors meeting and will make additional announcements that coincide with the June high school girls' lacrosse tournament.

This is the second time Augsburg has led colleges and universities in offering varsity women's sports. During 1995, the College was the first in the state and Midwest to offer women's varsity ice hockey.

Center for Democracy and Citizenship gets 3-year \$1.2 million grant. The W.K. Kellogg Foundation last week approved a 3-year, \$1.2 million grant for Sprockets, a St. Paul-based educational program operated in partnership with Augsburg College's Center for Democracy and Citizenship program.
