Accreditation received by Physician Assistant Program – The Accreditation Review Commission on Education for the Physician Assistant (ACC-PA) has granted Continued Accreditation to the Physician Assistant Program sponsored by Augsburg College. Continued accreditation is an accreditation status granted when a currently accredited program is in compliance with the ARC-PA Standards.

Continued Accreditation remains in effect until the program closes or withdraws from the accreditation process or until accreditation is withdrawn for failure to comply with the Standards. The approximate date for the next comprehensive review of the program by the ARC-PA will be September 2018.

October 16 visit by King, Queen of Norway – King Harald V and Queen Sonja of Norway will be at Augsburg October 16 as part of a larger visit to the Midwest and New York. Their Majesties will attend a student worship service at the Chapel followed by a reception. Norwegian students from colleges and universities throughout the region will attend the invitation-only event.

Next Convocation Series Speaker is October 26 – Students, faculty and staff had the opportunity to hear from Walter Brueggeman, a renowned theologian, during the Bernhard M. Christensen Symposium last Monday and Tuesday. Brueggeman explored how the human drive to accumulate things can destroy community and what it means to public policy.
