MAJOR ACHIEVEMENTS AND HAPPENINGS

October 16 visit by King, Queen of Norway – King Harald V and Queen Sonja of Norway will be at Augsburg on October 16 for an invitation-only student worship service and reception. The visit to the College is part of a larger visit to the Midwest and New York. Norwegian students from colleges and universities throughout the region will attend the invitation-only event.

As part of the visit, the College is presenting Their Majesties with a Peace Pole, which will be installed in the lawn near Hoversten Chapel, in honor of the College's long-standing relationship with the people of Norway. The Peace Pole will be engraved with the word "Peace" in the languages representing many of the communities with which the College is connected.

Augsburg students who want to attend the Chapel service must request a ticket by October 12. To request a ticket, students must send an email with their full name and contact information to eventrsvp@augsburg.edu. Requests will be honored first-come, first-served.

The award, from The Washington Center for Internships and Academic Seminars, was presented Oct. 3 at the National Press Club. The College is only one of six in the nation to receive the prestigious award in recognition of community involvement and civic engagement. During May, Augsburg received the highest federal honor available for civic engagement and service learning when it earned President Barack Obama's 2010 Presidential Award for Community Service. The College is the first in Minnesota to earn this honor, and only one of six in the nation.
