Augsburg College's commitment to experiential education was recognized for the third time in as many years **October 5** when the National Society for Experiential Education presented President Paul C. Pribbenow with the 2012 William M. Burke Presidential Award for Excellence in Experiential Education. Registration opens October 12 for Nobel Peace Prize Forum. The 25th annual Nobel Peace Prize Forum, which will feature keynote addresses by two Nobel Laureates. Tawakkol Karman is a journalist and human rights activist from Yemen. Muhammad Yunus, an economist and entrepreneur, is recognized as the "father of the microcredit movement," the extension of very small loans at low interest rates. Yunus, founder Grameen Bank, started the movement by lending primarily to women who lived in rural communities.
