Augsburg College will serve as a polling place for residents of Minneapolis Ward 2, Precinct 7 for the General Election on **November 6.** It is an honor – and responsibility – to serve the neighborhood in this way. State law prohibits campaigning within 100 feet of a polling location. This means that all individuals are prohibited from wearing clothing, buttons, or stickers that promote a particular candidate or issue that is on the ballot.
