- Muhammad Yunus, 2006 Peace Laureate, an economist and a leading proponent of the microcredit movement.
- Dr. Paul Farmer, cofounder of Partners in Health, and a leading thinker on health and human rights. He also serves as chair of Harvard Medical School's Department of Global Health and Social Medicine.
