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Planning Sheet: Bachelor of Music, Music Education

Prepares students to become certified music teachers in the public schools. Students may become certified to teach at the elementary through the secondary levels and may select either vocal/general or instrumental/general emphasis. In addition to applying to the Music Department and Bachelor of Music education major, **candidates must also apply to the Department of Education for acceptance into the music education licensure program.** Recommendation for licensure is granted only to students in the Bachelor of Music education major who have completed all music requirements and have maintained a cumulative GPA of 2.50 in music courses. Music requirements must also be complete prior to student teaching.
