*These credits can be transfer credits from other colleges, or additional transfer credits outside the AFA program from Anoka Ramsey. If a student does not have additional transfer credits, the student should consider using these credits to add a minor or double major (such as Literature, Language, Theory; Film; Communication Studies; New Media; or Art). Students may choose to add individual courses for personal interest as an option as well.

Advising Notes:

- ENGL2203, 2204, 2207, 2208, and 2209 will transfer in as lower division literature electives equivalent to ENL280 Genres.
- ENGL2210 will transfer in as a lower division literature elective, ENL270 Themes.
- ENGL2230 American Literature to 1865 and ENGL2235 American Literature Since 1865 will transfer in together as an upper-division major elective in literature, ENL352 American Literature from 1900 – 1945.
- ENGL2220 British Literature to 1800 and ENGL2225 British Literature Since 1800 will transfer in together as an upper-division major elective in literature, ENL336 Age of Victoria.
- In addition to completing a major, students need to complete the Core Curriculum and earn at least 128 credits. Residency policy requires that students complete at least 32 credits at Augsburg, with at least 24 of the last 32 credits in residence.
