

Anoka-Ramsey Community College Approved courses for Mathematics majors

For students planning to transfer to Augsburg University and major in Mathematics, the following departmental equivalencies are provided. This guide is intended as a supplement to Augsburg's general transfer guide available online at http://web.augsburg.edu/registrar/transfer/guides/arcc.pdf.

The Mathematics major at Augsburg is available as a <u>Bachelor of Arts</u> or a <u>Bachelor of Science</u>. There is also an option for <u>secondary teaching licensure</u> with a Bachelor of Science. In addition, minors are available in both Mathematics and Statistics. Courses are available in the traditional undergraduate program. Courses must be completed with a C- or better to transfer to the major.

The table below lists the Anoka-Ramsey College courses that have approved equivalencies at Augsburg.

- MATH 2200 Linear Algebra and MATH 2201 Introductory Linear Algebra are not equivalent to Augsburg's courses. MATH 2210 Differential Equations will transfer in as elective credit MAT 269. These three courses do not count towards the Mathematics major.
