

MINNESOTA STATE COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES
ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
INVER HILLS COMMUNITY COLLEGE
AND
AUGSBURG COLLEGE

This Agreement is entered into between Inver Hills Community College (herein Inver Hills) and Augsburg College (herein Augsburg).

This Agreement and any amendments and supplements, shall be interpreted pursuant to the laws of the State of Minnesota.

Inver Hills has established an Associate in Science (A.S.) degree in Accounting, and Augsburg has established a Bachelor of Arts (B.A.) degree in Accounting, and will facilitate credit transfer and provide a smooth transition from one related program to another.

The Board of Trustees of the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities is authorized by Minnesota Statutes, Chapter 136F to enter into Agreements and has delegated this authority to colleges and universities.

It is mutually agreed upon:

Admission and Graduation Requirements

- A. Augsburg admission requirements apply to both direct entry students and to students who transfer under this agreement.
- B. A cumulative GPA of 2.5 or better is recommended for transfer student admission at Augsburg.
- C. The Accounting major at Augsburg does not have a separate admission process.
- D. Students accepted into Augsburg must fulfill all graduation requirements to earn the BA degree.

Transfer of Credits

- A. Augsburg operates on a course credit system where each course is offered for 1.0 credit, which equates to 4 semester hours.
- B. Augsburg will accept up to 64 semester credits from 2-year institutions to apply toward degree requirements at Augsburg.
- C. A minimum of 32 course credits (128 semester hours) is required for Augsburg's BA degree.
- D. Courses will transfer as described in the Program Articulation Table included in this Articulation Agreement.
- E. Remedial/developmental and technical courses do not transfer to Augsburg.
- F. A grade of C or better is required to transfer any course to Augsburg.
- G. Since the A.S. degree includes credit from Inver Hills Community College and Metropolitan State University, an official transcript from each institution is required.

- H. Based on the prescribed courses of study, it is likely that students who complete the A.S. degree in Accounting at Inver Hills will reach *Advanced Transfer* status, that is having 13 or more transferable credits (52 semester hours) upon entering Augsburg.
- I. Inver Hills students who achieve *Advanced Transfer* status will receive the following waivers/substitutions in regard to completing the general education requirements (Core Curriculum) at Augsburg:
 - a. Waiver of the Entry Level Critical Thinking Requirement
 - b. Placement into REL 300 instead of taking REL100/200
 - c. Waiver of one Lifetime Fitness requirement (dependent upon transcript evaluation)
- J. This agreement implies no guarantee of *Advanced Transfer* status to Inver Hills students. Transfer standing will be determined by the Registrar's Office at Augsburg in the evaluation of final official transcripts.

Terms of Agreement

- A. The Chief Academic Officers or designees of the parties to this agreement will implement the terms of this agreement, including identifying and incorporating any changes into subsequent agreements, assuring compliance with system policy, procedure and guidelines, and conducting a periodic review of this agreement.
- B. Program curriculum and requirements listed in the Program Articulation Table may change.
- C. This Articulation Agreement is effective on 06/01/2011 and shall remain in effect until 06/01/2016 unless terminated or amended by either party with 90 days prior written notice.
- D. This Articulation Agreement will be reviewed by both parties beginning on or after 12/01/2015.

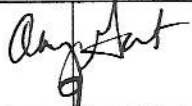
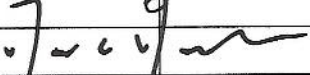
