

Minneapolis College Approved courses for Education

For students planning to transfer to Augsburg University and major in Education, the following departmental equivalencies are provided. This guide is intended as a supplement to Augsburg's general transfer guide available online at <http://web.augsburg.edu/registrar/transfer/guides/mctc.pdf>.

The Education major at Augsburg is available as a Bachelor of Science degree for [Elementary Education](#) and [Secondary Education](#) (Biology, Chemistry, Language Arts, Math and Physics), or a Bachelor of Arts degree for K-12 ([ESL](#), Art, Music, Health and Physical Education) and [Special Education](#). The Elementary and Secondary Education license programs are available in the traditional Day program or Evening AU program. Special Education and K-12 English as a Second Language are only offered in the AU program.
