

North Hennepin Community College Approved courses for Education

For students planning to transfer to Augsburg University and major in Education, the following departmental equivalencies are provided. This guide is intended as a supplement to Augsburg's general transfer guide available online at http://web.augsburg.edu/registrar/transfer/guides/north hennepin.pdf.

The Education major at Augsburg is available as a Bachelor of Science degree for Elementary Education and Secondary Education (Biology, Chemistry, Language Arts, Math and Physics), or a Bachelor of Arts degree for K-12 (ESL, Art, Music, Health and Physical Education) and Special Education. The Elementary and Secondary Education license programs are available in the traditional Day program or Evening AU program. Special Education and K-12 English as a Second Language are only offered in the AU program.
