Am I doing a field placement this year?

• If you are a **full-time student**: YES - you are definitely doing a field placement this year.

- If you are a **part-time student**:
 - YEAR ONE NO FIELD
 - YEAR TWO YES
 - If you are in YEAR THREE* NO
 - If you are in YEAR FOUR* YES



Metro vs. Non-Metro

•Twin Cities Metro:

- Defined as all agencies within Anoka, Dakota, Hennepin, Ramsey and Washington counties;
- and county agencies ONLY in Carver, Chisago, and Scott counties

•Non-Metro: All other



FIELD EDUCATION = SOCIAL WORK'S "SIGNATURE PEDAGOGY"

Field Requirements

1. Hours to be completed

- **Generalist year:** Minimum 420 hours (14-16 hours per week)
- Specialization year: Minimum 500 hours (16-18 hours per week)

*Note that some agencies may require students to complete more than the minimum hours required by Augsburg. This is their prerogative and your agreement to accept that placement is your agreement to complete additional hours.

2. Length of placement

- September to end of April
- May stretch into the 1st summer session if field agency requires and with consultation from your field seminar instructor
- <u>May not work more than 24</u> <u>hours/week</u>



Field Requirements, cont.

3. Supervision:

- 4 hours/month
- 2 hours MUST be from a licensed MSW-level social worker (LGSW, LISW, or LICSW)
 - If your agency does not have a licensed social work on staff, Augsburg can help you find an external licensed social work supervisor
- Group or individual

3. Successfully complete all field seminar class requirements (including a signed Learning Agenda at mid-term and final)

4. Obtain malpractice/liability insurance



Exceptions for Field**

Agency Requirements:

- 1) Agency requiring students to complete more than just the minimum requirements (you could go beyond the total minimum of either 420 or 500).
- PAID internships may require you to work more than weekly maximum hours. Maximum allowed is 20 per week.

Placement in Schools:

Public schools have different academic calendar that goes beyond our Augsburg academic calendar. You will be expected to stay until end of the public school's year i.e in June

MSW/LADC Dual track

Can do a maximum of 24 hours per week

MSW/LADC Dual Track Placement

- MSW/LADC Dual track
 placements occur during the
 clinical specialization year
- Placements begin Fall 2024
- Supervision by LADC & licensed MSW occurs across the placement (can be the same person or two separate people)

- MSW/LADC portion of placement is 500 hours, September-April
 - No more than 24 hours/week

- LADC-only portion continues as a summer block placement (May-August)
 - Additional 380 hours
 - May work up to 40 hours/week
 - LADC Field Seminar (SWK 622)



Employment Site Placements

- Must have different roles & responsibilities than your job.
- Field and employment hours must be distinct.
- No crossover of clients.
- Field instructor and employment supervisor cannot be the same person.
- Must complete Employment-based Field Placement application (in MSW Field Manual) and meet with Prof. Sabala and the proposed field supervisor to discuss the proposal. Prof. Sabala must approve all employment site placements.

Preparation Steps

• Determine your learning goals and interests

• READ THE MSW FIELD MANUAL.



Preparation Steps

• **Resume:** Prepare to send to prospective field instructors/agencies

• Include categories such as education, employment, relevant volunteer experiences, and professional affiliations

• Prepare an e-mail message highlighting your educational goals, interest in their placement, any relevant experience

 May consult handout with questions for field instructors (on MSW Resource Board)




Preparation Steps



Timeline: Metro Area

- April 3rd, 3- 5 pm: Metro-Area MSW Field Consortium Practicum Agency Information Day Session (on-line). It will be a virtual event.
 - After 5 pm, MSW students may begin contacting agencies to request interviews
- April 4th May 3rd Agency Interview Period
- May 6th by 5 pm Agency & Student Choice Forms are Due
- May 17th by 5 pm Students will be notified of placements via your augsburg.edu email address
- May 24th Round Two interviews begin for students still seeking a placement.
- June 30, 2024 deadline for all students to have secured a placement

Interviewing

- How many agencies should you interview at?
 - We recommend planning to schedule 4+ interviews.
- Some things to keep in mind:
 - Dress professionally (even if the interview is on Zoom)
 - Spell check/proofread your written materials
 - Come prepared with questions for the interviewer (see the MSW Resource Board for a list of suggested questions to ask during an internship interview)
 - If you decide to not attend an interview, call and cancel.



Field & COVID-19

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- During interview process, find out what the agency's expectations are for the internship, in terms of vaccination and masking requirements.
- *If you have any concerns regarding COVID policies or protocols, communicate promptly with your field seminar faculty member and field instructor

Placement Choice Forms

- You will receive a link from Lydia to a GOOGLE FORM
- You will be able to list up to 8 choices (rank them from your top choice to your last choice); you can also specify if there are any agencies you will not intern at.
 - Only list agencies that you have interviewed at
 - Only list agencies that you would be willing to be placed at
- You <u>must</u> submit the Choice Form by May 6th at 5 pm or you will not be able to participate in Round 1 field matching.



Placement Notifications

- Emails notifying students and agencies of matches will be sent out on **May 17th.**
- Emails will only be sent to your augsburg.edu accounts
- Emails will contain notification of the match and lots of other information about next steps. Please read these emails carefully.



What if I did not match with an agency in Round 1? Don't worry there is still Round 2

- **Don't panic!** This happens to a small percentage of students at all 4 schools often some of the most talented students.
- Feedback: If there were interviewing problems shared by prospective field instructors, those concerns will be shared with you.
- May 24th: You will be emailed a list of available placements and can begin contacting them and setting up interviews (we may discuss which might be a good fit for you).
- Less formal process: begins in late May
 - you contact prospective field instructor, interview, and discuss potential match.



Remember...

- The goal is to have a placement by the end of May.
- If you decide to not attend an interview, call and cancel.
- You must get the placement. We just facilitate the placement process.

• If you have not secured a placement by JULY 31st 2024, you will not be able to participate in a field placement during the 2024-2025 academic year and will have to delay your field placement until the 2025-2026 academic year.



What if I want a placement that is *not* in IPT?

- Contact Prof. Sabala via e-mail with the name of the agency, a contact person (if you have a name), and an email address for the contact person.
- Prof. Sabala will contact the agency to see if they meet Augsburg and CSWE accreditation guidelines and if they are interested in hosting an Augsburg email.

• Please allow the field staff to do this exploration, i.e. do not contact them yourself!



Disability Accommodations in Field Placements

"If you are a person who has ADHD, a mental health disability, a learning disability, a physical/sensory impairment, a chronic health condition, are on the autism spectrum, or have another disability, you can consult with the CLASS Office to explore reasonable accommodations and support for your field placement experience. Dual Relationships

- Social workers who function as educators or field instructors for students should not engage in any dual or multiple relationships with students in which there is a risk of exploitation or potential harm to the student. Social work educators and field instructors are responsible for setting clear, appropriate, and culturally sensitive boundaries (Standard 3.02(d), NASW Code of Ethics).
- The student and field instructor have the duty to disclose the existing relationship and its nature to the MSW Field Director.

- 2nd year clinical track students only
- \$7500 stipend for students selected
- Program Requirements:
 - Interview specifically for the Hamm Clinic Horizons Internship



Transforming Internship @ Northeast Youth & Family Services

Goals:

•\$8000 stipend

Includes culturally responsive supervision & mentoring

Qualifications:

- clinical year students only
- Identify as Black, Indigenous, or Person of Color



Other Stipend/Paid Internships

- In IPT, first use the Sort function and select "Stipend Offered"
- Can also use the Search function and enter search term "stipend" or "paid" to find agencies who list stipend or paid options
- When interviewing at an agency that advertises paid internships, ask about stipends or if interns are paid on an employee contract -BOTH are now allowed by CSWE*
