

Loan repayment through NHSC

The National Heath Service Corps is offering a loan repayment program. To be eligible for up to \$60,000 in an initial loan repayment award, Corps members are required to practice full-time for at least two years or part-time for four years at an NHSC-approved site. An award of \$30,000 is available for two years of half-time service. Approved sites are located across the country in Health Professional Shortage Areas (HPSAs).

Many types of health care facilities are NHSC-approved sites. About half of Corps members serve in federally-supported health centers. Other approved sites are rural and Indian Health Service clinics, public health department clinics, hospital-affiliated primary care practices, managed care networks, prisons, and U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement sites.
