### Nobel Peace Prize Forum

Augsburg students have a unique opportunity to become a Peace Scholar. The five colleges in the Nobel Peace Prize Forum

consortium have established a Peace Scholars program that will include two students from each of the colleges. The students selected as scholars will participate in the Peace Prize forum and study in a summer travel seminar experience designed to deepen their understanding of issues related to peace, justice, democracy, and human rights.

### Criteria and Application:

- > minimum GPA of 3.0
- > letter of application
- > 1,000-word essay articulating interest in & goals for being a peace scholar.
- > full-time first year, sophomore and junior students.
- > two letters of recommendation one faculty letter and one from either a faculty or staff member.

The application deadline: Jan. 30. Submit applications to Orv Gingerich, Augsburg coordinator for the Nobel Peace Prize Forum. The Peace Scholars Committee will review all applications and interview the finalists. Augsburg's two scholars will be selected by Feb. 15. #### SAMUEL HUNTINGTON PUBLIC SERVICE AWARD PROGRAM INVITES APPLICATIONS FROM GRADUATING COLLEGE SENIORS

### Deadline: February 15, 2008

The Samuel Huntington Public Service Award provides a \$10,000 stipend for a graduating college senior to pursue one year of public service anywhere in the world. The award allows recipients to engage in a meaningful public service activity for a year before proceeding on to graduate school or a career. The award was created in honor of the late president and chief executive officer of the former New England Electric System, now National Grid (http://www.nationalgridus.com/). Applicants should develop a proposal for public service in the United States or abroad. The proposal may encompass any activity that furthers the public good. It can be undertaken by the student alone or working through established charitable, religious, educational, governmental, or other public service organizations. All graduating students from accredited colleges in the United States are invited to apply. Non-U.S. citizens are eligible to apply but must be graduating from a U.S. college or university.

### For Next Year Juniors: The Prestigious Jay and Rose Phillips Scholarship

The Phillips Scholars Program recognizes and rewards private college students who strive to make life better for people with unmet needs in Minnesota communities. Phillips Scholars identify community concerns, explore ways to create social change, and develop ambitious programs to meet a variety of human and social needs.

Students from 16 eligible private colleges and universities are invited to apply. Each campus will select a finalist, who will go on to compete for one of six \$15,250 Phillips Scholars awards.

The Augsburg College Deadline for Application is February 16.
