ABOUT THE COUNCIL

The Metropolitan Council is the regional planning agency providing essential services to the seven-county Twin Cities metropolitan area. The Council was created by the Minnesota Legislature more than 40 years ago to plan and coordinate the growth and development of the metro area. The Council's 17-member board is appointed by and serves at the pleasure of the Governor.

The strength of our organization is our people! We employ over 4,000 people in five major divisions: Metro Transit, Environmental Services, Community Development, Regional Administration, and Metropolitan Transportation Services.

Metro Transit is one of the country's largest transit systems providing approximately 95% of the bus trips taken annually in the Twin Cities. Metro Transit operates the Blue Line light rail and Northstar commuter train lines (and currently under construction, the Green Line light rail); and provides over 100 bus routes using a fleet of some 900 buses.

Environmental Services (MCES) is nationally renowned for its work treating wastewater, monitoring air and water quality, and water supply planning. MCES operates and maintains approximately 600 miles of sewers and treats up to 300 million gallons of wastewater per day at seven regional treatment plants.

Community Development provides local communities with assistance to support their future growth and redevelopment. In addition, affordable housing opportunities are provided through the Metropolitan Housing and Redevelopment Authority (Metro HRA); services are provided for the planning and funding for regional parks and trails (51 parks and 300+ miles of trails); and Livable Communities grants are provided to participating communities for their development projects.

Regional Administration provides support services to the entire Council. These services include departments for Legal Counsel, Communications, Internal Audit, Government Affairs, Finance, Administration, Human Resources, Information Services, and Diversity (Office of Equal Opportunity).

Metropolitan Transportation Services (MTS) is charged under state and federal law to oversee the planning of our region's transportation systems including highways, transit, aviation, bicycles and pedestrians. MTS also operates and promotes alternative modes of transportation including Metro Mobility, Metro Commuter Services, and Transit Link.
