Expect The Unexpected

Know that stuff happens; it's college and life and we never know what to expect. The resilient students (that's you!) regroup, recover, ask for help, and keep going.

Hi everyone and welcome to the start of another school year at Augsburg! This is a busy time for you as you adjust to new classes, changing schedules, and other challenges as a college student. It is also a busy time for the TRiO/SSS staff as we work to plan workshops and other activities, and work to make sure you're all on track for graduation.

Commencement and graduation will be here before you know it. This is an exciting time for you, but also a time that may be filled with anxiety as you think about post-Augsburg plans: work and internships, graduate school, and dreaded loan repayments. If you are planning to finish this fall or in the spring you should have by now completed your **Graduation Application.** This is your intent to the College that you will be done with all requirements to receive your diploma. You must work with

your faculty advisor to complete the Grad App, and it is usually completed at least one year before you plan to



finish degree requirements.

And to clarify, "commencement" and "graduation" are two terms or events that are often used interchangeably, and these events are not mutually exclusive. Commencement is the ceremony where you walk across the stage, shake the President's hand, and receive your (empty until the College verifies you have actually finished) diploma holder. Graduation means you

have completed all requirements to receive said diploma.

For all students it is helpful to keep track of your loan debt. Knowing your loan debt, knowing your loan lender, and knowing how much your loan payments will be is essential for your post-graduation budgeting plans. Visit the National Student Loan Data System for Students (NSLDS)

www.nslds.ed.gov/ to access your federal loan and Pell information.

As you're checking in with your TRiO/SSS advisor we'll discuss other things you should be doing, or should have already done, to remain on the road to degree completion.

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Message From Melody: You Can Make a Difference!

For most of our readers, this Presidential election will be your first opportunity to vote. What an exciting time! Did you know that before 1971, United States citizens could not vote until they were 21 vears old? The constitution was amended because 18 year old men were being drafted for the Vietnam War at that time. but were not able to vote. Even though it has been over 40 years since this change has been made, young people still lag far behind other age groups in their turn out at the polls. Politicians are more likely to listen to the voices of young people if young people make it a priority to let their voices be heard.

So make it a priority to register and vote in the 2012 Presidential election but make sure it is an educated vote. What issues

are important to you? Take some time to get to know the platforms of the candidates. You can go to **presidentialelection.com** to register to vote and even if you do not get registered ahead of time, you can register on Election Day at your polling place as long as you are able to provide proof of residency in MN. To find your polling place, go to http://pollfinder.sos.state.mn.us/.

Another way you can make a difference is by writing or calling congress members about issues that are important to you. If fact, you can help to continue the funding of TRIO programs by stopping by our office and taking a few moments to write a post card to our Senators and/or your local Representatives. TRIO is a federally funded program and unfortunately

every year we must fight to continue the funding. Politicians are moved by the stories of their citizens. If TRIO has been instrumental in your educational success and you believe it is important, please take a few moments to complete a post-card.

TRiO/Student Support Services

The Student Support Services (SSS) program is one of three TRiO programs originally funded under the Higher Education Act of 1965, whose objective is to help students overcome class, social, and cultural barriers to complete their college education.

Augsburg TRiO/SSS started in 2001 and is funded by the U.S. Department of Education and Augsburg College. The Minnesota Department of Education Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) provides additional funding for Summer Bridge. Augsburg TRiO/SSS annually provides individual and group services to 160 students.

All Augsburg TRiO/SSS services are provided at no cost to program participants. Students participate in TRiO/SSS throughout their enrollment at Augsburg College.

Augsburg TRiO/SSS also selects 25 incoming first-year, TRiO-eligible students to participate in its Summer Bridge component.
