# FALL HOURS OF OPERATION

In order to keep our students and advisors safe, TRIO/SSS staff will be available virtually by appointment during fall semester. The TRIO/SSS Office will be "open" Monday-Friday from 8:00am-5:00pm. Current TRIO/SSS students may schedule a meeting with their TRIO/ SSS advisor through ScheduleOnce.

You can also make a virtual appointment with your TRIO advisor through the TRIO/SSS Moodle page which is available to current TRIO/SSS participants. 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### AUGSBURG TRIO/SSS IS AWARDED THROUGH 2025

After a rigorous application process and months of waiting, Augsburg University was recently notified by the U.S. Department of Education that the TRIO/SSS grant proposal has been awarded. We will be able to continue serving first-generation underrepresented students for another 5 years! Thank you to everyone who has supported Augsburg TRIO/SSS and continues to do so.

Augsburg TRIO/Student Support Services (SSS) provides individual and group services to 160 students annually, so that they may overcome class, social, and cultural barriers to complete their education. TRIO/SSS advisors provide comprehensive planning and support to program participants in academic, financial, and personal areas as students progress toward graduation. All Augsburg TRIO/SSS services are provided at no cost to program participants. Students participate in TRIO/SSS throughout their enrollment at Augsburg. The U.S. Department of Education has funded Augsburg TRIO/SSS with \$294,722 for 2020-21.

Augsburg TRIO/SSS also selects 25 incoming first-year, TRIO-eligible students to participate in its Summer Bridge component. Augsburg University provides additional funding for Summer Bridge, approximately \$125,000 this year or 30% to match the TRIO/SSS grant award.

TRIO/SSS began in 1968 and is one of the eight federal "TRIO" programs authorized by the Higher Education Act to help college students succeed in higher education. It recognizes that students whose parents do not have a college degree have more difficulties navigating the complexity of decisions that college requires for success; it bolsters students from low income families who have not had the academic opportunities that their college peers have had, and helps students with disabilities overcome obstacles preventing them from thriving academically.

"The COVID-19 pandemic has worsened the systemic inequality and financial hardship which keep promising students from succeeding in college. Student Support Services is needed now more than ever," said Maureen Hoyler. Hoyler is the president of Opportunity in Education in Washington, D.C., a non-profit dedicated to furthering the expansion of college opportunities for low-income, first-generation students, and students with disabilities.

For more than 50 years, the Student Support Services program has made important contributions to individuals and society as a whole by providing a broad range of services to help students succeed. This vital program can and does make all the difference.

# VOTE!



Unless you've been hibernating under a rock, you should know that it's a U.S. presidential election year. This means that you should exercise your right to vote! Did you know that college students have traditionally voted at one of the lowest rates of any group in the United States?

"Young adults (ages 18-29) made up about 21% of the voting eligible population in 2014, but voter turnout for this demographic has reached record lows in recent years. In midterm elections like 2018 and in off-year elections like 2015, local offices are on the ballot and can be decided by a matter of a few votes. Local offices and issues have a direct impact on a student's home and college community. Officials make decisions on topics like student debt, funding for higher educa-

tion, and the economy" (campusvoteproject.org). However, it doesn't have to be that way.

So, if you want to make sure that you have a job after graduation, or not be in so much debt, or even afford basic necessities such as affordable healthcare, then you need to vote! Every vote counts. Studies have shown that young adults are not voting not because they aren't engaged in the democratic process or because they don't care, but because there are barriers that prevent them from voting. These barriers can range from missing a deadline to register to vote, not knowing the issues and candidates on the ballot, not receiving accurate information on deadlines and processes for voting absentee, by-mail, early voting, or where to vote on Election Day (campusvoteproject.org).

College student voters matter. Young people have the power to make a difference. The way to achieve this is to make your voice heard at the polls on election day! 

# NEW TRIO/SSS MOODLE SITE

This fall semester, we are launching a TRIO/SSS Moodle Site that will be available to all TRIO/SSS participants. The TRIO/SSS Moodle site will have different tools and resources available for students. Resources will include information on navigating online learning, financial aid literacy, class-year specific information, and much, much more! It will provide information for your success at Augsburg, as well as help connect TRIO/SSS students to each other, especially now that our physical office is currently not open. This Moodle site will be used in advising meetings with your advisor, but can also be navigated on your own, so make sure to check back frequently for updates!



## EQUIPMENT CHECKOUT

With classes moving to hybrid and online modalities this fall semester, students will need to have reliable access to a computer and internet. Augsburg is offering an expansion to their laptop checkout program, allowing students to checkout laptops for the entire semester. There are approximately 135 machines available for long term checkout and priority will be given to students with financial need. Students taking a Math or Computer Science course that requires a device to show your work in an online environment may borrow a Wacom drawing tablet through Lindell Library at the circulation desk. There are 10 tablets available for TRIO/SSS students. (Note: If you already have a touch screen laptop, it works the same as a Wacom drawing tablet).

### VIRTUAL SUMMER BRIDGE PROGRAM



This past July, we welcomed twenty-four incoming first-year students to our 19th Summer Bridge program and our first ever "virtual" Summer Bridge Program! During this intensive fiveweek virtual experience, students got a head start on their Augsburg education by taking two college courses, totaling 6 credits, for free. In COM 111: Introduction to Public Speaking, students learned research skills and honed their speaking abilities by presenting individual and group speeches. The class concluded with students competing in a virtual speech tournament in which groups presented on different speech topics. The competition

gave students an opportunity to highlight what they learned and a chance to support, and challenge, their classmates.

COM 111 was paired with a brand new course, LIB 130: Fake News 101: Research Skills, Information Assessment, and Seeking the Truth. In this complimentary course students learned tools to become efficient, effective, and critical researchers and they were introduced to scholarly research and databases. Students also learned how to distinguish quality sources through research papers and other assignments. The use of appropriate data and sources helped support their speeches in COM 111.

Summer Bridge participants, who were eligible, received a Summer Bridge Promise Grant which covers full tuition up to four years. In addition to virtual classes, students also attended virtual academic support seminars, workshops, and other activities that help provide a smooth transition to Augsburg in the fall. Congratulations to the 2020 Virtual Summer Bridge Class!


