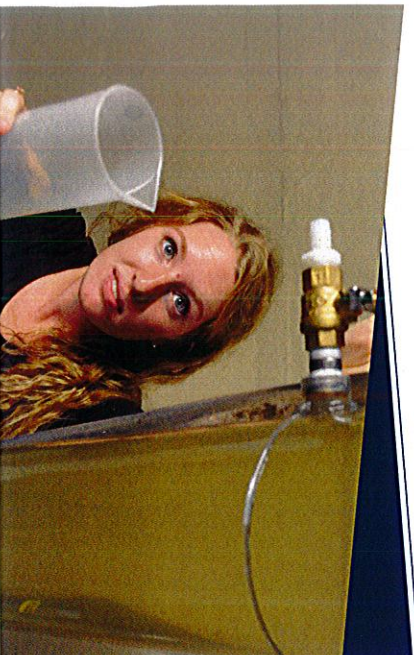


Internship Opportunities

About the Metropolitan Council

The Metropolitan Council is the regional policy-making body, planning agency, and provider of essential services for the seven-county Twin Cities metropolitan region.

The Council's mission is to foster efficient and economic growth for a prosperous metropolitan region. This work is accomplished by the efforts of four main divisions:

- Metro Transit and Metropolitan Transportation Services – Provides public transit and transportation planning.
- Environmental Services – Manages the regional wastewater collection system.
- Community Development – Helps shape the area's regional growth plan and provides affordable housing programs.
- Regional Administration – Supports the administrative day-to-day services for the Council.

Summer Internships

Council interns will benefit from on-the-job training and mentoring, along with participating in team projects, social outreach and professional development.

Interns also build professional relationships and enhance their interpersonal skills.

Qualifications

To apply for a Metropolitan Council summer internship, students:

- Should be currently enrolled in post-secondary education
- Or have graduated post-secondary education in the last 12 months



Urban Scholar interns will gain essential leadership skills and professional experience through a 12-week learning program. Urban Scholars also develop career pathways to positions of influence in public service.

Qualifications

To apply for an Urban Scholar internship, students:

- Should be currently enrolled in post-secondary education
- Must have completed at least one year of post-secondary education and be in good academic standing
- Or have graduated post-secondary education in the last 12 months
- Come from a diverse racial, ethnic and/or low socio-economic background
