English Teaching Assistant Opportunity

United International College, Zhuhai, China

Augsburg College has a formal relationship with a new college in China, the United International College (UIC) in Zhuhai, located just a ferry ride across the bay from Hong Kong. UIC is recruiting U.S. college graduates to assist in teaching English to undergraduate students. The goal of the college is to develop a comprehensive English language liberal arts curriculum.

College graduates are invited to submit an application for a one year ESL assistant teaching assignment. If you are a student with interest in teaching English, learning Chinese and living in an international setting, this may interest you. UIC is still developing as a college, so the teaching assignment requires a person who is flexible, adaptable and willing to take initiative.

UIC will reimburse airfare, provide single room dormitory housing, and pay a monthly stipend. Chinese language classes free of charge are provided in return for 20 hours per week of classroom teaching and tutoring.

The English Language Centre (ELC) at the United International College (UIC) offers courses under General Education required subjects for all year one and two students to help them reach an acceptable standard of English equivalent to students from tertiary institutions in Hong Kong. ELC also provides discipline specific assistance to students for their majors. The <u>Academic Reading and Writing</u> course is tailor-made for students in different majors to increase their vocabulary, refine their writing skills and write term papers in English. <u>Effective Oral Communication I</u> and <u>Effective Written Communication I</u> (three hours of non-credit bearing required courses) are offered to Year 3 and Year 4 students.

In addition to the curriculum, the ELC runs quite a number of extra-curricular activities every week to provide students additional English practice to enhance their English proficiency.

The objectives of the ELC are as follows:

To enhance students' general proficiency in English to a level appropriate for university study, To equip students with relevant communicative skills in both academic, business and social contexts, To provide authentic situations as far as possible for students to develop their proficiency in all four language skills in an all-rounded manner.
