Specifics

- Nine week internships to conduct research in a faculty program at Cornell's Geneva Experiment Station
- Gain research experience and learn about the research and extension conducted at Cornell
- Additional programs and field trips will be offered
- Benefits/support included: \$4,500 stipend, housing, and assistance with transportation costs
- Program starts on June 1, 2016 (May 31 for travel) and runs through July 29, 2016 (July 30 for travel) **Eligibility**
- Must be a U.S. citizen or permanent resident at least 18 years of age by May 31, 2016
- Must have completed two, and preferably three, years of college level study in one of the life sciences by June 2016
