General Mills Foundation Awards Project Grant

On December 11, 2007, the General Mills Foundation awarded SquashScholars a \$10,000 project grant under its "Celebrating Communities of Color" program. That program is a \$500,000 initiative now in its fourth year. Since 2004, the program has served more than 250,000 people in the metro area, most of whom are people of color. According to Program Manager Adrienne Jordan, fifty recipients were chosen from over 200 applications. Jordan, who made a site visit in October with two employee volunteers during our third week of operations, acknowledged that SquashScholars was a very new program, but one with great energy, significant volunteer support, and high potential.

The project funded by this award will focus on fitness and nutrition. Graduate students from The Schools of Kinesiology and Public Health will design a nutrition curriculum and plan and a fitness model to focus our attention on these areas and collect appropriate data on student outcomes. At the end of the school year their analysis will be available in a written report and through our website.
